Vocabulary  echolocation

Dolphins are large animals that live in the ocean. They can be six to twelve feet long and are very heavy. Most dolphins weigh over one thousand pounds. You might think that dolphins are large fish, but they are not. Female dolphins are called cows. Male dolphins are called bulls. Young dolphins are called calves. Dolphins travel in groups, or pods, of up to twelve dolphins. A dolphin breathes air through a blowhole on the top of its head. The blowhole is like its nose. Under the blowhole, a dolphin has two eyes. They have great eyesight and can see both in the water and out of the water. They have echolocation, or clicking noises, to find their way around. Echolocation helps dolphins find their food, too. Dolphins eat fish and squid. Dolphins use their flippers, dorsal fins, and flukes to swim, jump, and play in the water.
