HOW TO MAKE

Folders

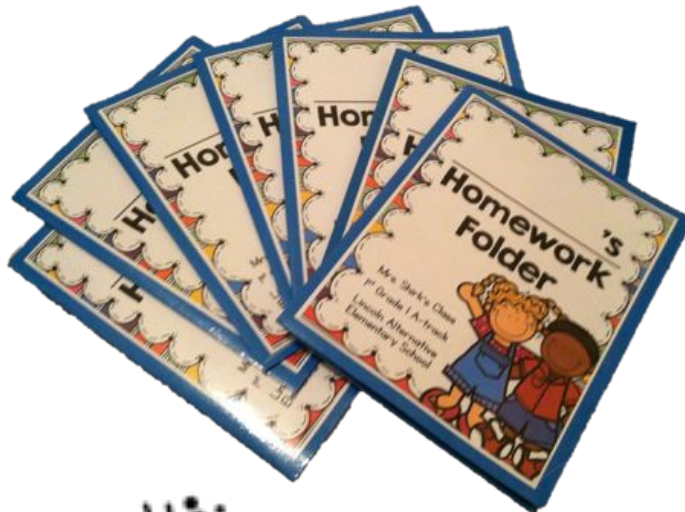
I buy the cheapest two pocket folders I can find. You might be thinking: How do they last all year if they are cheap folders? The answer - I laminate them after I glue the front and back cover. Unless they get lost (which does happen), they last all year! So be sure to make a few extras in case one or two littles lose their folder. ☺

After editing and printing the cover, I glue it on the front. Then I glue the homework helper on the back cover. Finally, I laminate! By using the cover with a line for the child's name, you can prepare these folders in the summer and be READY for back-to-school early! When you get your class list, write in their names, and you are d-o-n-e!

Fonts

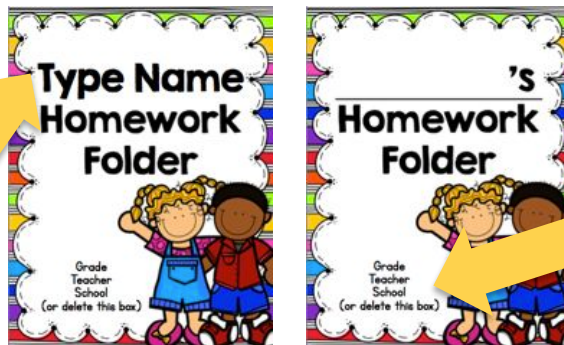

To make editing easier, download and install these fonts before you open the PowerPoint (.PPTX) file. On this document, I have used the following fonts:

PowerPoint

Use PowerPoint to open the file. Choose the slide you want to edit. When you click on the following phrases, you will be able to edit the text.

- Type Name
- Grade/School/Teacher



*Remember that you are able to rearrange and/or delete textboxes as you see fit!

If you have already downloaded the fonts, the sizing will be the same. If you choose to use your own fonts, you may have to adjust the size of the text to fit the document in an appealing manner.
