

Have you ever heard of a sea cow? Manatees are often considered the cows of the sea because they are large marine mammals that spend their days grazing. Manatees live in shallow and calm rivers, canals, and coastal areas. They

are known for their gentleness and are a brownish gray color. They can grow up to 13 feet long and weigh as much as 3,000 pounds! With two large flippers on each side of their bodies and one big flat tail, manatees move slowly. They move anywhere from three to five miles per hour. Since manatees are mammals, they need to come up out of the water for air. They usually come up every three to four minutes, but if needed, manatees can hold their breath for up to twenty minutes. Manatees are herbivores, which means that they only eat plants. They feast on turtle grass, algae, and other plants in the water.

Although their slow movements and eating habits make manatees similar to cows, it is believed that manatees are distant relatives of
