# LUCKY SOUNDS 

The purpose of this activity is to provide practice segmenting words with three and four phonemes.

## EXAMPLE three sounds



For the word hen, students should point to:
${ }^{\text {st }}$ dot: /h/sound
$2^{\text {nd }}$ dot: /e/ sound $3^{\text {rd }}$ dot: $/ \mathrm{n} /$ sound

Optional: Students can slide finger across the dots and blend the word back together.

## EXAMPLE four sounds



For the word globe, students should point to:

$$
\begin{aligned}
& l^{\text {st }} \text { dot: } / \mathrm{g} / \text { sound } \\
& 2^{\text {nd }} \text { dot: } / / / \text { sound } \\
& 3^{\text {rd }} \text { dot: } / \overline{/} / \text { sound } \\
& 4^{\text {th }} \text { dot: } / \mathrm{b} / \text { sound }
\end{aligned}
$$

Optional: Students can slide finger across the dots and blend the word back together.
