



LOOMED-KNOTTED

The loom-knotted technique is a refined method of rug making. Our skilled artisans work on horizontal looms, tying individual knots by hand onto the warp threads with the aid of a guiding rod or tool. This process combines traditional hand-knotting with greater efficiency, while still maintaining a high level of craftsmanship and detail. The pile can be cut, looped, or combined to create different surface effects. Patterns are achieved through colour variations, loop heights, and surface carving for added complexity and dimension.

• Key characteristics

Pile surface without backing, glue, or latex Woven at a wide loom and then cut in sizes Low height which gives an exclusive look Fast production time but requires big quantities

Warp setup: 10–14 days

Weaving time: 2 days for size 6'6" x 9'8"
