



HAND-KNOTTED

The hand-knotted technique is one of the most intricate and time-honored methods of rug making. Crafted on vertical looms, each piece of yarn is tied individually to the warp by hand - a process that requires immense skill and patience. The quality of a hand-knotted rug is defined by the number of knots per square inch, with higher densities allowing for exceptional detail and precision.

• Key characteristics

Pile surface without backing

Every knot is tired individually 80 knot/inch
Created to last for generations
Impressive piece of handwork
Warp setting: 4-5 days
Time honored production method: 80-90 days to weave size 6'6" x 9'8"
What you see on the back is a mirror image of the front
