



HANDLOOMED

The handloomed technique is a traditional method of rug making. Our skilled artisans manually operate a loom to create the fabric. It requires three weavers working simultaneously to weave a handloomed rug, with a master weaver positioned in the middle. The warp thread is lifted with a thin metal rod to form rows of loops, which can either remain to create a looped surface or be cut open for a cut pile. Patterns are created by colour vertical stripes or by alternating cut and loop surface effect. Patterns can also be cut in the pile after weaving for added depth.

• Key characteristics

Pile surface and cotton cloth backing Weaved at a wide loom and then cut in sizes Typically made in wool and/or viscose Loom setup: 10–14 days

Weaving time: 2 days for size 6'6" x 9'8"
