

- ✓ NO PREP - just print & go




**CLOSED SYLLABLES**  
a single **vowel** sound followed by one or more **consonants**

at it up  
cub spit  
kidnap unzip

Think: The consonant is *closing* the vowel.  
The vowel usually makes a short sound.

**OPEN SYLLABLES**  
end with a single **vowel**.  
*\*Y acts like a vowel.*

hi me go  
sky pro  
open begin

Think: The vowel is not closed by a consonant, so it is *open*.  
The vowel usually makes the long sound.



**A SILENT SYLLABLE**


is a syllable with a single **vowel** followed by a **consonant** and ending with a **silent letter e**

bike note  
close mistake

Think: The **silent e** makes the vowel say the long sound.

Silent e syllables have long vowel sounds.

**A VOWEL PAIR SYLLABLE**

is a syllable with two consecutive **vowels**  
\*Includes **vowel teams** and **diphthongs**

road pay  
stew amount

The letters **w** and **y** act as **vowels**.

This syllable type makes the long vowel sound and the variant vowel sound.

## CLOSED SYLLABLES

**-le FINAL STABLE SYLLABLES**  
a syllable with a **consonant** followed by the letters **le, al, or el**  
\*Often at the end of a word

**table**    **uncle**  
**medal**   **chapel**

This syllable type is also known as **consonant -le syllable**.

 This is the only syllable type without a vowel sound.
